OUR COMMITMENT



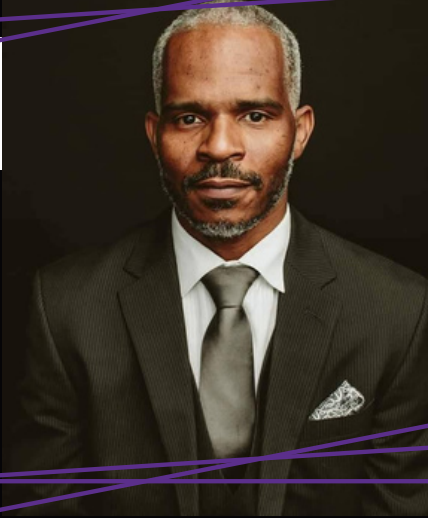
Miles of Freedom is dedicated in its mission to empower, equip and educate individuals, families and communities impacted by incarceration. The work that MOF does to help individuals and families gain access to financial stability and succeed in the community is essential in creating a fairer and more equitable Dallas.

We take pride in a robust set of programs that includes our Reentry Assistance Program (REA). The Reentry Assistance Program supports individuals through case management, job readiness workshops, and employment assistance with a focus on securing and retaining livable wage employment and contributing to equity in the workforce.

Our Transition to Employment program is an innovative arm of our social business, offering opportunities for members to access paid work ethics training while utilizing MOF resources to move forward with securing permanent employment. Finally, our Produce Distribution Program has been serving the community since 2019 and is available to the community five days a week without any income or zip code restrictions.



A WORD FROM OUR FOUNDER AND CEO



Texas Department of Criminal Justice Statistical website over the past ten years shows a decline in the annual number of people incarcerated in Texas. In 2021, TDCJ reported a total of 117,876 men and women incarcerated in Texas prisons. This was a decrease of about 10 thousand for the previous year. However, even with this decrease, a common and consistent trend within this demographic is over 50% of those incarcerated are between the ages of 21 and 39. The average amount of time incarcerated ranges from two to ten years. In 2021, Texas released 44,889 and over 108,000 were on parole or some type of community supervision. With the recent challenges of COVID, TDCJ budget cuts and staffing shortages, the successful transition of those incarcerated will become more complex and challenging. As a result, families and communities struggling with the impacts of incarceration are often left feeling overwhelmed and inadequately equipped to support loved ones returning home.

Over the last decade, Miles of Freedom has worked in the gap to bridge holistic services supporting individuals, families and communities impacted by incarceration. As we move into 2023, we are confident and poised to continually work for those that need our services. We understand when our members are successful, families are stronger, communities are vibrant and public safety is reinforced.

Within the coming weeks, we will be sharing Miles of Freedom's 3-year Strategic Plan. Our areas of focus are Governance, Operations, Programs and Development. We embrace the opportunity to now build upon a legacy of ten years. As a grassroots organization that began with four volunteers and a donated space, to the awesome work being done now, we are grateful. Our work is not accomplished in silos!

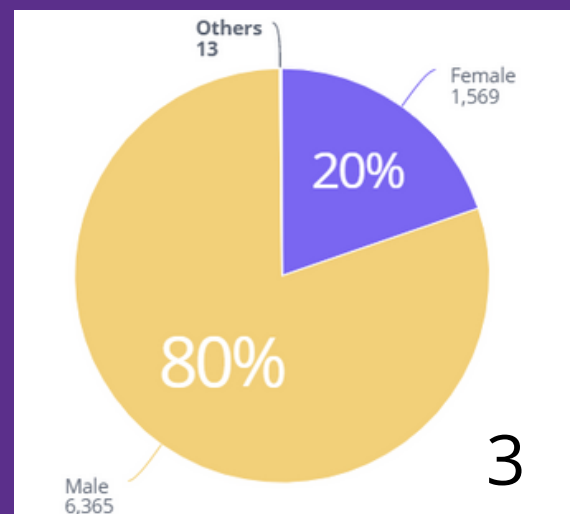
